## **Owning Property in a Historic Preservation District**

Dear Main Street Property Owner,

Thank you for being part of Kendallville's new Downtown Local Historic District! Local designation is an honor and documents that your property contributes significantly to the unique historic and architectural character of downtown Kendallville.

In an effort to retain that historic integrity, the city of Kendallville recently passed an ordinance creating an Historic Preservation Commission (HPC). The Commission is made up of the following members: Keith Ballard, Terry Housholder, Stephane Langelier, and Jerry Spaw. There is currently one vacancy. They meet monthly (on the first Wednesday at noon) to review applications from building owners who would like to make changes to the exterior façade of their building. This helps to ensure that changes being made meet the guidelines approved by the city.

There are certain responsibilities that come with Historic District property ownership, and going forward, If your building falls within the Historic District (see attached map), most work on your property that would change the outward appearance of the building will require a Certificate of Appropriateness (COA) approved by the Kendallville Historic Preservation Commission or its staff. Many minor repairs or maintenance activities can be approved quickly at the staff level (generally within 24-48 hours). However, other projects that affect the historical integrity of the building require a more thorough review and will need HPC approval prior to beginning construction.

The application is simple to complete and can be found – along with the historic guidelines -- on the city's website at <u>www.kendallvillein.org/documents</u>. Staff is available to assist you throughout the COA application process.

If you are planning to apply for a façade grant from the Kendallville Redevelopment Commission, you will need to have a Certificate of Appropriateness from the HPC to be eligible for funding.

Completed applications should be sent to Debra Parcell with Indiana Landmarks at <u>dparcell@indianalandmarks.org</u>. Once a Certificate of Appropriateness is obtained, a placard will be placed on the exterior of the building to let others know that the work has been approved.



Experience the Heart of Kendallville is hosting a workshop to share the basics of vintage window operation and restoration to help encourage local property owners to preserve and protect the historic integrity of their structures.

#### WHY SHOULD YOU ATTEND?

When you learn the different parts of a vintage window and how they operate, you can repair them to last for decades. It's a simple, step-by-step process to replace broken sash cords, remove and replace broken glass and deteriorated window putty, and use epoxy for deteriorated wood repair.

Beyond the obvious function of letting in sunlight and ventilation, windows are an important architectural element that give a property its distinctive character. In addition to maintaining the original style, preserving vintage windows retains the old growth lumber used to construct them — wood that is tight grained and longer lasting than new wood you can buy today.
