Commercial Guidelines

Rear Elevations

(Rear Elevation only; side elevations of a corner building are street-facing and follow the same guidelines as front elevations.)

Recommended:

- 1. Rear elevations should be kept simple in appearance.
- 2. Maintain and preserve historic doors at rear entrances.
- 3. If new doors are required, use single-lite glass-and-wood or other historically appropriate doors.
- 4. Maintain and preserve historic windows on rear elevation.
- 5. If new windows are required, replace windows in their original size/type. Rear elevation windows could be vinyl.
- 6. Durable metal siding may be considered in cases where the brick/mortar are seriously deteriorated.
- 7. Maintain a simple appearance for rear entrances. Signs and awnings are appropriate for the identification of businesses.
- 8. Screen HVAC units and service equipment through landscaping or wood and/or brick enclosures, or place units and equipment on roofs out of view from the street.
- 9. RDC can help with funding for rear elevation paint if colors are chosen from Sherwin Williams pre-approved historic color palette, found here: https://www.sherwin-williams.com/en-us/color/color-collections/historic-paint-colors.

The Historic Preservation Commission does not recommend and generally does not approve:

- 1. Covering windows with plywood.
- 2. Vinyl siding.
- 3. Replacement of windows in any size/type other than what was originally there.
